Golden Raindrops Flowering Crabapple

Malus 'Schmidcutleaf'

Description:

A highly attractive and unusual crabapple with deep cut foliage that gives the tree a delicate appearance and yellow fruit; highly disease resistant and excellent for high screen or lawn tree

Ornamental Features

Golden Raindrops Flowering Crabapple is bathed in stunning clusters of fragrant white star-shaped flowers with yellow eyes along the branches in mid spring, which emerge from distinctive rose flower buds before the leaves. It has attractive dark green deciduous foliage. The deeply cut lobed leaves are highly ornamental and turn an outstanding orange in the fall. The fruits are showy yellow pomes carried in abundance from early to mid fall.

Landscape Attributes

Golden Raindrops Flowering Crabapple is a dense deciduous tree with a picturesque vase-shaped form. It lends an extremely fine and delicate texture to the landscape composition which can make it a great accent feature on this basis alone.

This is a relatively low maintenance tree, and is best pruned in late winter once the threat of extreme cold has passed. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Golden Raindrops Flowering Crabapple is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Accent
- Shade

Planting & Growing

Golden Raindrops Flowering Crabapple will grow to be about 18 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 12 feet. It has a low canopy with a typical clearance of 3 feet from the ground, and is suitable for planting under power lines. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 40 years or more.

It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.
